The Pastor's Pen

Prayer

My third installment from "What The Bible Says About...The Ultimate A-Z Resource" (2001, Thomas Nelson) will be on prayer. The selection on prayer in this book is long, so I will pick out a few important facts for you to consider.

Do you ever feel as if your prayers bounce off the ceiling rather than reaching God? If so, consider carefully the prayer of Daniel for the release of his people from captivity (Daniel 9). It is a testimony to the fact that God answers prayer—in His time and according to His purposes—as the angel Gabriel announced (Dan. 9:24-25).

However, God does not answer any and every prayer as the one praying would like. Why, then, did He respond to Daniel's? Here are some observations:

1. Daniel's prayer was the result of his study of Scripture. *The timing of Daniel's prayer is highly significant.*

July Fellowship dinner hosted by Jean Mourey

It came "in the first year of Darius" around 539 B.C. (Dan. 9:1). That was the year in which Babylon fell to the Persians, a truly astounding event that must have sent Daniel back to the Scriptures to search for understanding.

2. Daniel confessed and repented of his people's sins. *By all appearances, Daniel was a godly man of faith who lived a life of utmost integrity, both before and after being deported to Babylon. Yet despite his own personal innocence, he confessed to numerous sins as a member of God's wayward people. Four times he told the Lord, "We have sinned." (Daniel 9:5, 8, 11, 15) This is a powerful example of corporate confession, in which one accepts personal responsibility for the sins of one's people (see Lamentations 1:18).*
3. Daniel fasted and prayed for a period of time. *The Bible does not say exactly how long Daniel's prayer of confession lasted, but it was probably more than a day, as he refers to fasting (Daniel 9:3)...Only after this prolonged period of confession did Daniel ask the Lord for mercy (Daniel 9:16-17). He did not even raise the possibility of restoration, despite God's promise in the Law and his awareness of Jeremiah's prophecies (Daniel 9:2). He asked only that the Lord would act on behalf of His own interests (Daniel 9:18-19).*

Prayer is not a gimmick by which we charm or coerce God into giving us what we want. Prayer is a sober-minded acknowledgment of our true situation before the Lord and an admission of our need for His divine help. Are you prepared to pray like Daniel?

Prayer is a scary, awkward proposition for many people. It's the kind of activity that they would just as soon leave to the religious "professionals". But Scripture encourages us with numerous examples of people who demonstrate that prayer is an everyday activity for everyday people. (pgs. 312-313)

It's true. Many people say, "I don't know how to pray." And, "I don't know what to ask for." Or "God's not going to listen to me." But you know the truth. Prayer is as simple as "I've sinned, Lord, forgive me" or it can be far more involved. If you are not in the habit of praying, here are a few suggestions:

1. Pray on your knees. It humbles you before God and, unlike praying in bed, you won't fall asleep while you are praying.
2. Make a list of who/what you want to pray for. Don't be afraid to take a moment in prayer to check your list. You will find after a while that you don't need to sneak a peek. You'll remember what's really important. And if you forget something, you can always go back into prayer.
3. Be consistent. Prayer should be a part of your everyday routine; like eating, taking a shower, feeding the dogs. It should not be an afterthought or done only when you really want something. God wants to talk with you even if you have nothing to say.
4. Take time to listen for God. Prayer shouldn't be one-sided. Sometimes you have to stop and listen for the voice of God. If you don't hear it, don't worry, God is there and is listening to you.
5. Don't expect to get everything you ask for. One of the best pieces of advice ever given to me on prayer is that sometimes the answer is "no". God's job is not to give us everything we ask for because sometimes the things we ask for are not best for us. So if you get a "no", it's ok.

Remember that prayer is our communication with God and it is truly important if you want to grow in your relationship with God! Blessings, Jo

Welcome/Quorum/Call to order

A quorum was declared by Jo and the meeting was called to order with prayer given by Jo.

Approval of Minutes: All members present have read the minutes of the last meeting. A motion was made to accept the minutes. The motion was seconded and passed unanimously.

Treasurer's Report: Betsy gave each member a copy of the monthly budget and the year to date budget. Betsy also reported the final payment of \$3995.30 has been made for the replacement of the church railings, leaving a balance of \$9120.58 in the restoration fund. Betsy reported our participation in the food bank requires collecting checks made out to our church and then writing a check to the Methodist church for One Harvest. She will inquire if the original checks can be made to the Methodist church. A motion was made to accept the report. The motion was seconded and passed unanimously.

Committee Reports

Christian Education: Tammy had nothing to report.

Membership/Mission: Jean reported the Pensacola newspaper will be changing its format and we will be charged for submitting a weekly notice. They have not yet notified Jean of what the cost will be. It was decided to wait and see what the cost will be before making a decision as to whether to continue submissions. Jean asked for information regarding other newspaper publications we might send our weekly notice to.

Personnel: Leslie asked that Pastor Jo Kublik be excused from the meeting. Leslie then reported she had discussed with Pastor Jo any concerns or desires that should be addressed. She then proposed the mileage payment to the pastor be increased from 25 cents per mile to 50 cents per mile. Leslie reported the pastor drives approximately 300 miles per year to make visitations and carry out other pastoral duties. A motion was made to accept the proposal. The motion was seconded and passed unanimously.

Property: Betsy reported she has met with two different companies regarding repair of the stained glass windows in the church. The estimates given were \$2900.00 and \$17,000.00. As there is such a large disparagement between the two estimates Leslie suggested we try to contact someone who is an expert in this area and ask exactly what needs to be done. A motion was made to accept the proposal. The motion was seconded and passed unanimously.

Adjournment: A motion was made to adjourn the meeting. The motion was seconded and passed unanimously. Jean closed the meeting with prayer.
