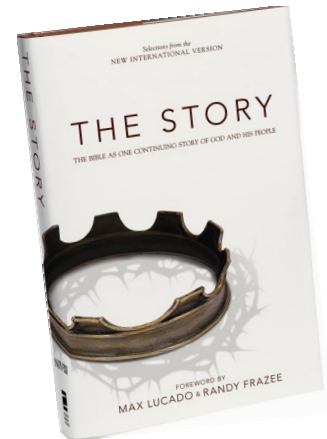

Welcome/Quorum/Call to order

A quorum was declared and the meeting was called to order with prayer given by Jo.

The scripture reading was from Proverbs 29.

Approval of Minutes: The minutes of the April 6, 2015 meeting have been read. A motion was made to approve the minutes. The motion was seconded and passed.

Treasurer's Report: As the treasurer was absent a copy of the latest report was given to each member. The report was discussed. A motion was made to approve the report. The motion was seconded and passed.

Clerk's Report: Jean reported that she has been attempting to contact Nancy Model with the Methodist church regarding sponsoring a food box with One Harvest.

Jean discussed having the July fellowship meal as an outdoor picnic style meal. The idea was accepted and we will proceed with plans.

Jean passed a suggestion from the Women's Bible Study group that the liturgist stand with the greeters until Margaret begins playing and then speak to the congregation asking them to prepare for worship in silence. Christian Education: Tammy will order new material for small group.

Stewardship: Linda had nothing to report.

Tammy has told Jane Simmons she will help make a camp happen for Vision of Hope the week of August 10 - 14, 2015. A motion was made to approve this. The motion was seconded and passed.

Jo noted that Betsy will need to find out if our liability insurance will be sufficient.

Adjournment: A motion was made to adjourn. The motion was seconded and passed. Jo closed with prayer.
