Session Highlights

September 10, 2015

Your session held a regularly scheduled meeting in September. Some of the items discussed were:

Treasurer’s Report—for the month of August we were ahead \$240.64.

Clerk’s Report—Jean is working on getting a historic marker placed in front of our sanctuary. Jean and Margaret have agreed to remain as session members for three more years. Margaret has agreed to be property chairman with her husband, Terry, as her committee. The nominating committee will meet again to select nominees for treasurer, auditor, nominating committee chairman, and one session member.

Property —Betsy spoke with King Air about installing a permanent air conditioner in the Open Hearts meeting room and was given an estimate of \$8,244. Betsy researched prices on window units for that room instead and found that they are available at Home Depot and Lowe’s for under \$1,000. The decision was made to purchase a window unit to put in that room.

Christian Education—Tammy reports that study of “The Story” has been going well. Women’s Bible Study has begun studying the book of Acts. A \$1,000 donation has been received to fund the Open Hearts ministry.



When was the last time you finished a medication and just tossed the empty bottle in the trash? Have you ever thought that that pill bottle might be useful for someone else? Well it is!

Medical personnel in Malawi often wrap pills in bits of paper for their patients, as they don't have pill bottles to put them in. Can you



imagine? The Malawi Project collects empty pill bottles to send to these physicians so that their patients have a way to keep their medications clean and dry.

You can help! Whenever you empty a pill bottle, simply remove the label and bring the bottle to the collection box the next time you attend church. We will then mail them to The Malawi Project for distribution. Please make sure that any sticky residue is removed from the bottle by placing it in boiling water or by rubbing it with Goo-gone.

A pill bottle—something so simple that we take for granted can mean the world for someone else! Please support this important mission if you are able!


