Session Meeting Minutes

November 10, 2013

Welcome/Quorum/Call to order

A quorum was declared by Jo and the meeting was called to order with prayer given by Jo.

Approval of Minutes As the copy machine is not working it was unanimously decided to email the minutes to each member for approval.

Treasurer's Report Betsy Dodson passed to each member a copy of the Income/ Expense report for 10/01/2013 to 10/31/2013 showing Checking account \$21,968.71 and Money Market account \$28,879.62.

Committee Reports:

Christian Education(Gerry Yandle) Jo reported that Small Group is using the Book of James and will use the booklet Celebrate for Advent. Brad confirmed he will organize the Jesse tree programs.

Stewardship(Linda Lade) Linda passed a report of pledges made for 2014. Showing \$40,000.00 in pledges made.

Linda stated she feels that closing the gate at the end of the parking lot sends a message that we are not welcoming. A discussion followed regarding the public use of the lot. Jean asked what the churches liability is regarding an injury. Brad stated the church would be liable for any non-vehicular injury incurred in the parking lot. Brad made a motion to conduct a discussion regarding this matter with the property committee and

come back to the session with a recommendation. The motion was seconded and it carried unanimously.

Worship(Jo Kublik) Jo reminded that she and Margaret will not be away Sunday November 24, 2013 and Gerry Yandle will conduct the service with Brad Schild providing music. Leslie Yandle noted Gerry will be releasing the prayers from the prayer tree at that time. Jo also noted she will be absent January12, 2014, and two Sundays in May 2014. She will have the 2014 calendar ready by the middle of December. Jo noted there will be no session meeting next month. She reminded us of the calendar events coming up in December 2013 and January 2014 -

December 5 2013 - 5th Sunday

January 5, 2014 - Congregational meeting to elect new Elders and Corporation meeting to elect members of the nominating committee

January 18, 2014 - Elder training

January 19, 2014 - Installation of new elders

January 19, 2014 - Session meeting.

Membership/Mission(Nicole Frenk) Jo requested the names of nominees to be shown to her and explained the names go before the church for a vote.

Personnel(Leslie Yandle) Leslie had nothing to report

Property(Brad Schild) Brad reported the repairs to the roof have been completed. He has received estimates to have the railings repaired. The estimates range from very high to very low. Betsy stated that the contractor giving the low estimate only found one or two sections in need of repair but the contractor from Renaissance Repair did a more thorough inspection and discovered rust inside a few of the uprights. A discussion ensued debating the merits of repair vs replacement. Betsy and Brad will investigate the costs and report back to the session.

The copy machine has a broken part. Brad has spoken with a Lanier representative who will try to get the replacement part. Jo reported that Margaret found a copy machine for sale \$250.00 that is advertised as business use. Buying vs leasing was discussed. Brad mentioned his company might possible be replacing machines and we may be able to purchase one of the ones they will be disposing of. Jo stated Margaret has set up an account with UPS for making copies and the

church will be billed. Nicole noted that as part of the churches affiliation with The Chamber of Commerce we may use their copy machine for small batches of copies. The only requirement is we provide paper.

Nicole asked if a barrier will be in place for Gallery Night to prevent people from entering the pulpit area. Brad responded "yes". Brad reported he has spoken with Ross Pistoius regarding the refinishing of the Church doors. Terry Neustaedter has purchased the stain and finish and has sanded and repaired the doors and one has been stained.

Betsy noted the work will begin this week on the concrete. Betsy questioned the purchasing of supplies for the church. Brad stated the church has a Sam's Club card with a tax exempt number. Anyone who notices a need for supplies should notify Brad and he will purchase the items. Also, it was noted that anyone who does purchase items for the church can obtain either reimbursement or tax deduction donations.

Brad notified the Fellowship Hall will be used for a Birthday party the Saturday following Christmas and a wedding next August.

Adjournment: Jo closed the meeting with prayer.

A meeting was held to review the budget. Brad went over the past year line by line with recommendations for amounts to be changed in the coming year. Line item 507 is removed. Line item 510 is added for Choir expenses. These changes were discussed and approved unanimously. Brad noted that the 2014 budget is \$10,000.00 more than our projected income. He recommended Betsy Dodson review the 2013 expenditures to see if the amount spent on miscellaneous is possibly accounted for elsewhere. The budget is attached.
