Session Meeting February 10, 2013

Welcome/Quorum/Call to order

A quorum was declared by Jo and the meeting was called to order on February 10, 2013, at 11:55 A.M. with prayer given by Jo. Jo then read the scripture 1 Peter: 4 -10 and initiated a short discussion as to the meaning of this passage.

Approval of Minutes

The minutes were provided by Nicole Frenk. A move was made to approve the minutes. The move was seconded. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report

As Tula Anthony is presently hospitalized, the treasurer's report will be given at the next Session meeting. Linda reports a balance of \$14,694.30 in the checking account and \$18,863.23 in the money market account. The annual statistical report was

reviewed and discussed, with no changes. Jo informed the meeting that the Presbytery assessment for our per capita is \$467.84 for this year as opposed to the \$200.00 budgeted. Jo said we could possibly use a portion of a \$10,000.00 donation made previously. Means to make up this shortfall were discussed. It was decided to pay the balance from the checking account. Later meetings will discuss ways to budget this money.

Leslie recommended using a line item code in the budget to identify expenditures.

Committee Reports

Property (Brad Schild)

Brad reported on meeting with architect Carter Quina. Mr. Quina will plan a Discovery Day with his class in order to give us an estimate on cost of repairs to the church building exterior. He also will attempt to get approval for his architecture class to perform renovations as a class project.

Brad reported on organ repairman's report. The computer in the organ is defective. Discussion was then whether to repair or replace the organ. A motion was made to begin a capitol campaign to raise money that would be specifically for repairs to the building including repair or replacement of the organ as needed. A motion was made to approve. The motion was seconded. The motion carried.

Linda and Jean volunteered to work on fund raising project - mason jars to collect change to be emptied into collection container at 1st Sunday dinners.

Jo will obtain a banner to attach to the front railing informing the community of preservation/restoration of the building.

Christian Education (Bill Kerrell)

Bill and Gerry reported that this year the Lenten focus will be on *Ashes to Fire* beginning with our Lenten dinners and continuing through the Bible Study Group and Wednesday dinners until Easter.

Stewardship (Linda Lade)

Linda reported we are doing well with tithing pledges.

Worship (Jo Kublik)

Jo reported that 6 members will be attending the Ruling Elder Training at Dogwood Acres on Feb. 23, 2013. Jo confirmed with Gerry that he will lead the service on March 10, 2013.

Membership/Mission (Nicole Frenk)

It was decided that we will not participate in Scratch Ankle as it is the same weekend as Cursillo.

Jean reported she will submit weekly church news to the Pennsacola News Journal and The Santa Rosa Gazette. Jean also reported the placement of Prayer Shawls and an invitation to join at Yarns and Things, 5211 Dogwood Dr, Milton.

Personnel (Leslie Yandle) Nothing to report.

Membership/Mission (Nicole Frenk)

Nicole suggested to make the Pet Blessing part of "Dog Days of Summer", a very successful Relay for Life event at Santa Rosa Medical Center last year. She will find out if the event will be held again this year.

She will contact the Santa Rosa Arts & Culture Foundation and the Milton Woman's Club regarding participation in Light Up Milton Gallery Night the first Friday in December.

Personnel (Leslie Yandle)

Leslie is waiting to hear back from COM if they are going to approve a three-year contract for Jo. Should the contract be approved, Jo requested June 9th, August 11th, and November 24th off.

Apples—Very, Very good!

A few years ago a group of salesmen went to a regional sales convention in Chicago. They had assured their wives that they would be home in plenty of time for Friday night's dinner. In their rush, with tickets and briefcases, one of these salesmen inadvertently kicked over a table which held a display of apples. Apples flew everywhere. Without stopping or looking back, they all managed to reach the plane in time for their nearly-missed boarding...

ALL BUT ONE!!! He paused, took a deep breath, got in touch with his feelings and a twinge of compassion for the girl whose apple stand had been overturned.

He told his buddies to go on without him, waved good-bye, told one of them to call his wife when they arrived at their home destination and explain his taking a later flight. Then he returned to the terminal where the apples were all over the terminal floor.

He was glad he did. The 16-year-old girl was totally blind! She was softly crying, tears running down her cheeks in frustration, and at the same time helplessly groping for her spilled produce as the crowd swirled about her; no one stopping and no one to care for her plight.

The salesman knelt on the floor with her, gathered up the apples, put them back on the table and helped organize her display. As he did this, he noticed that many of them had become battered and bruised; these he set aside in another basket.

When he had finished, he pulled out his wallet and said to the girl, "Here, please take this \$40 for the damage we did. Are you okay?"

She nodded through her tears. He continued on with, "I hope we didn't spoil your day too badly."

"Are you Jesus?"

He stopped in mid-stride ... and he wondered. He gently went back and said, "No, I am nothing like Jesus - He is good, kind, caring, and loving, and would never have bumped into your display in the first place.

The girl gently nodded: "I only asked because I prayed for Jesus to help me gather the apples. He sent you to help me, so you are like Him - only He knows who will do His will. Thank you for hearing His call, Mister."

Then slowly he made his way to catch the later flight with that question burning and bouncing about in his soul: "*Are you Jesus?*"

Do people mistake you for Jesus? That's our destiny, is it not? To be so much like Jesus that people cannot tell the difference as we live and interact with a world that is blind to His love, life and grace. If we claim to know Him, we should live, walk and act as He would. Knowing Him is more than simply quoting Scripture and going to church. It's actually living the Word as life unfolds day to day.

You are the apple of His eye even though you, too, have been bruised by a fall. He stopped what He was doing and picked up you and me on a hill called Calvary and paid in full for our damaged fruit
