## *The Pastor's Pen*

Last Sunday, July 28th, we focused on prayer and I'd like to add a little to what was said during our morning worship. I found the following in a book I've had for a long time. It's called "The Necessity of Prayer", written by Edward M. Bounds. In Sunday worship we focused on faith in prayer; and that the prayer does not need to be fancy or long and detailed. But in making time with God, we allow ourselves to feel close to God. But there's another element that we must remember and that's Trust. Mr. Bounds puts it a lot better than me, so here is the quote that really touched my heart.

*Our Lord puts trust as the very foundation of praying. The background of prayer is trust. The whole issuance of Christ's ministry and work was dependent on implicit trust in His Father. The center of trust is God. Mountains of difficulties, and all other hindrances to prayer are moved out of the way by trust and his virile henchman, faith. When trust is perfect and without doubt, prayer is simply the outstretched hand, ready to receive. Trust perfected, is prayer perfected. Trust looks to receive the thing asked for-- and gets it. Trust is not a belief that God can bless, that He will bless, but that He does bless, here and now. Trust always operates in the present tense. Hope looks toward the future. Trust looks to the present. (continued on page 2)*
