
To Our Special Church Family

Welcome/Quorum/Call to order: A quorum was declared by Jo and the meeting was called to order with prayer given by Jo. The Word Share was read from 1Corinthians, chapter 5.

Betsy introduced Terry Fortune, the agent with Beacon Insurance Agency who handles the insurance policies for the church. Mr. Fortune outlined the coverage in place at present and told us what it would cost to add wind and hail damage coverage. He gave a few different options for coverage, all of which would raise the premiums to unmanageable amounts. As the deductibles would be exorbitant, a motion was made to maintain the current coverage. The motion was seconded and approved.

Approval of Minutes: All members had read the minutes of the May meeting. Tammy noted an error in grammar. "This requires ADA compliance" should read "ADA compliance requires an AED on the premises."

Treasurer's report: Betsy reviewed the budget to date. She reported the following updates:

\$18,283.79 checking account \$28,898.67 Money Market

It was noted that Restoration accounting needs to be separate from the general budget. A motion was made to accept the report. The motion was seconded and approved.

Clerk's report: Jean presented a request from the Presbyterian Mission Agency requesting contact information for all members of our church. A motion was made to deny this request. The motion was seconded and approved. Jean presented a Theology Matters request for personal donations. Jean again reported the price to obtain an AED. Jo recommended this item be included in the 2015 budget. Jean reported the Fellowship Hall is ADA compliant other than the men's restroom. Tammy suggested the urinal be removed and replaced with a wheelchair accessible stall. Jean presented Beth White's request to be reinstated as an active member of the church. This request was unanimously accepted. Jean reported she has been contacting members who have been absent.

Property: Betsy reported the two front stained glass windows have been repaired and protective coverings installed. The side window has been caulked for stabilization. Bovard Studios has been paid in full for this work. Betsy noted she has been told to only clean the stained glass with water, no cleansers.

Christian Education: Tammy reported Sunday school for pre-k and k will begin Sept. 7 & that the material purchased to date is only appropriate for pre-k and k. She discussed her plans for creating a larger program. Tammy passed around her proposed agenda for outreach programs.

Stewardship: Margaret and Jo discussed "Minute for Mission". This will be a minute allotted each Sunday beginning Sept. 7 through Oct. 5 for each session member to explain to the congregation what her particular committee does and what the budgetary needs will be for the coming year. This is in preparation for the 2015 Planning workshop to be held October 11, 2014.

Worship: Margaret discussed changing the format of The Presby Press, reducing it to one page due to the cost of copying. It was agreed to reduce it to two pages for the next month.

Membership/Mission: Jean stated she will purchase post cards to be sent to members who have not been attending church recently.

Personnel: Leslie had nothing to report.

Old Business: Margaret reviewed her plans for catering the Presbytery meeting Sept. 9, 2014. A charge of \$10.00 per person for coffee, juice, donuts and lunch was agreed on.

Tammy suggested we become a support congregation for Family Promise. The "2 cents a Meal" program was discussed. Tammy proposed we use our portion of the monies collected to support the One Harvest program. Tammy informed us Beth White has volunteered to coordinate Operation Christmas Child this year. She also updated us on the Manna Food Pantry status.

Tammy then discussed the Prayer Shawl Ministry stating that the meetings have become more a social session than a ministry. A conversation ensued regarding how this situation can be rectified with the ministry joining with PWC.

Tammy told us of a group supporting parents of special needs children that is in need of meeting space and childcare during their meetings.

New Business: Jo noted she will be absent December 29, 2014 and January 4, 2015.

Betsy noted the Historical Society wants to use our Fellowship Hall this year for the last stop on the Ghost Walk.

Jean stated the Nominating Committee has begun working.

Session training will be held November 15, 2014.

The Holiday Faire will be December 5 from noon until 8 p.m.

Autism Pensacola will hold their Christmas party December 13, 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. As Tammy is no longer associated with this organization she has informed them they will need to renegotiate their usage of our facilities beginning January 1, 2015.

Sharon Stebbins will construct the Jesse tree for this year.

Adjournment: A motion was made to adjourn. This was seconded and the motion carried. Jean closed the meeting with prayer.
